The basic organization of research article should be as follows:

The Body

Introduction Literature Review Experimental Section/Research Methodology Results Discussion Conclusion

Closing Section

Acknowledgement (Optional) References Appendices (if any)

General Guide for Manuscript Writing

- Manuscript should be within 3500 6000 words including references and appendices (if any).
- Each manuscript must have an abstract not more than 500 words with a maximum of 6 keywords.
- The title of manuscript should not contain more than 15 words, Font size: 13 bold,
 Font type: Times new Roman, line spacing: 1.5

- All the headings viz. abstract, keywords, introduction, literature review, experimental section, methodology, results and discussion, conclusion, references etc. will be bold (size 12),
- Please use the decimal system of headings with not more than three levels.
- All manuscripts, except the language based ones, should be written in English.
- For manuscript in Bengali, Hindi, Sanskrit and Kokborok, the respective scripts in 12 font size should be used for the entire manuscript. In case of Bengali, *Abhra Kaalpurush* script, for Hindi, *Devnagari script* and for Kokborok, *Bengali/Roman* script should be followed.

✤ <u>Figure Numbering</u>

All figures are to be numbered using Arabic numerals.

Figures should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order.

✤ <u>Figure Captions</u>

- (a) Each figure should have a concise caption describing accurately what the figure depicts.
- (b) Figure captions begin with the term Fig. in bold type, followed by the figure number, also in bold type.

✤ Figure Placement and Size:

- (a) When preparing your figures, size figures to fit in the column width.
- (b) The figures should be 39 mm, 84 mm, 129 mm, or 174 mm wide and not higher than 234 mm.

✤ <u>Tables</u>:

- (a) All tables are to be numbered using Arabic numerals.
- (b) Tables should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order
- (c) For each table, please supply a table caption (title) explaining the components of the table.
